

### Steps for putting knots on each side of swivels.

- (1) Place all swivels on main line. (picture 1)
- (2) Pull off about 4' to 5' of main line while running the swivels to the roll of string. (picture 2)
- (3) Put a overhand knot in the main line and slide one swivel to the knot. (picture 3)
- (4) Pull off a loop of line that the roll of string can pass through, while keeping one swivel close to the knot and the rest of the swivels on the roll of string. (picture 4)
- (5) Place the roll of string through the loop, forming a knot on the side of the swivel. This should give you a knot on each side of the swivel. Knots about 1" apart. (pictures 5 & 6)

Note: There is no set distance that the knots have to be apart. Just make sure the swivels are far enough apart so the staging (drop lines) can not tangle with one another. We recommend they be 4' to 5' apart.

Repeat steps (2) to (5) till all the swivels have knots on each side.

### Steps for putting hooks on

- (1) Tie staging into loop, attach staging to swivel with a half hitch. (picture 7)
- (2) From front of hook, attach hook to staging with a half hitch. (picture 8)
- (3) Hook point should be up. (picture 9 on left)

Note: It is best to have the knot of the staging about half way between hook and swivel.
